

Warrior Men's Basketball Signs Two Hardwood Standouts

Wayne State University men's basketball coach Ron Hammye announced that Jeremy Denha and A.J. Parker will attend the university in the fall and play basketball.

Denha is a 6-7 forward who played at St. Clair Community College last season. He averaged 19.3 ppg. and 10.1 rpg. Denha, a junior, finished the season with 977 points and 606 rebounds.

"Jeremy is an outstanding athlete who works very hard," said Dale Vos, head coach of St. Clair Community College. "Jeremy has a tremendous work ethic and is always looking to become a better player. He will be a great fit at Wayne State University next fall."

"Jeremy will be able to play many positions for us in the fall," said Hammye. "He is a tremendous rebounder and has a great ability to get to the basket."

Parker is a 6-6 guard/forward from L'Anse Creuse North High School. As a senior prepster he averaged 16.5 ppg., 11.2 rpg., 4.0 bpg. and 2.0 apg. Parker shot 75 percent from the free throw line and 53 percent from the field.

"A.J. is the hardest worker I have ever had on my basketball team," said L'Anse Creuse North head coach, John Haas. "A.J. is extremely coachable and is always trying to improve on his weaknesses."

"A.J. is a very versatile player who is a great athlete," said Hammye. "A.J. would give us great depth at the guard and forward positions."

Wayne State University is a Division II institution in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The Warriors had an overall record of 12-14 last season. WSU is 35-6 at the Matthaei Building the past three seasons.
