This Week -

Wayne State (4-6-1, 0-1-1) will continue with CHA conference play as it hosts Air Force this Friday and Saturday, November 17 and 18. Both games will be held at 7:05 p.m. at the Fraser Ice Arena.

Last Games -

Wayne State saw its three game winning streak come to an end as it lost to visiting Findlay, 3-2 in overtime, last Friday. The two teams met again the following night in Findlay to again go into overtime as the game ended in a 3-3 decision.

In Friday's game, sophomore Tyler Kindle (Portage, MI/Bozeman Icedogs) scored with 14:50 on the clock to secure overtime. However Findlay scored at the 3:09 mark in overtime for the win. Also scoring a goal Friday night for WSU was sophomore Kalle Rahm in the third period.

On Saturday, the Warriors were leading 3-0 with 12 minutes left in the third, until Findlay scored three unanswered goals to push the game into overtime. Neither team could score in the extra period and left the game in a tie. Scoring goals for the Warriors were sophomores Brent Renfrew, Jason Durbin in the first period, and Daniel Rafner in the second period.

In the past two years, these two teams have met five times and three of the contests have resulted in overtime. In those three games, WSU is 1-1-1.

This season, Wayne State is 1-3-1 in overtime games and five of its six losses have been by one goal, including three overtime losses.

Nationally -

Sophomore David Guerrero (St. Leonard, Quebec) is ranked 20th among the nation's goaltending leaders. As a team, the Warriors' penalty killing is ranked 11th in the nation having killed of 57 of 64 (89.1%) penalties. WSU is the 16th least penalized team (81 for 165) in the country averaging 15.00 minutes per game.

CHA Honors -

Wayne State has already won two CHA awards this

season. Both freshmen Jackson Wilson and Jack Redwood were named CHA "Rookie of the Week" on October 23 and November 5, respectively.

Versus Air Force -

This is the first meeting between the two teams.

2000-2001 Captains -

Sophomores Jason Durbin and Keith Stanich have been elected this year's team captains by their teammates. This is the second year in a row that Durbin has been named captain.

Team Leaders -

For the second week in a row, sophomore Brent Renfrew (Fairbanks, AK) is atop the leader board in points with eight (five goals, three assists). He shares the lead with sophomore Daniel Rafner who has four goals and assists (eight points).

Freshman Chris Vail (Grosse Pointe Shores, MI/Vernon) is leading the newcomers in points with five (one goal, four assists).

Head Coach Bill Wilkinson -

Head Coach Bill Wilkinson begins his second year with the Warriors. Last season, he led WSU in its inaugural season to a 6-23-1 record. This season he is 4-6-1.

Wilkinson is no stranger to hockey as he

coached at Western Michigan for 17 seasons.

Wilkinson now posts a 323-330-55 record in 18 years of coaching (17 at WMU, 1 at WSU). He is also the chairman of the NCAA Men's Hockey championship selection committee.

Wilkinson is assisted by Danny Brooks, Willie Mitchell and Cal McGowan.

The CHA -

College Hockey America (CHA) is in its second year of existence. Members include Air Force, Alabama-Huntsville, Bemidji State, Findlay, Niagara and Wayne State.

Last season, Niagara won the CHA with a perfect 15-0 conference and a 29-7 overall record. Alabama-Huntsville was second with a 12-5 conference and 17-10 overall record, and Bemidji State was third with a 8-8 conference and 13-20 overall record. WSU was not eligible to compete for the conference title last season as the Warriors were an affiliate member only.

Next Up for the Warriors -

The Warriors will be on the road the next two weeks as they play at Bemidji State over the Thanksgiving weekend (Friday and Saturday, November 24 and 25) and then at Mercyhurst, December 1.

WSU will return home on Friday and Saturday, December 8 and 9 to host American International.
