

Kashmerick Named Softball First Team All-American

Wayne State University junior centerfielder, **Kelly Kashmerick (Flushing, Mich.)** was named First Team All-American by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association for the 2001 season.

Kashmerick, who batted .404 for the season, was named First Team All-Great Lakes Region and First Team All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. She led the conference in hits (82) and runs (43). She was second in the GLIAC in doubles (17) and total bases (118). Kashmerick finished third in the GLIAC in batting average. Kashmerick had 23 multiple games and five multiple RBI games.

Kashmerick is the first All-American since Amanda Jennings, who won the award in 1998.

Wayne State finished the 2001 season with a record of 37-20 overall and 15-5 in the GLIAC.
