Coming Up -

The Warriors are on Christmas Break and will not compete until they host the University of Findlay, on Monday, January 15, 2001, at 2 p.m. Also that week, the Warriors will host the University of Connecticut on Saturday, January 20, at 8 p.m., and Michigan State on Sunday, January 21, at 7 p.m.

Last Games -

Wayne State lost its third series in a row as it lost at the University of Maine on December 7 and 9, 2000. The Warriors have now lost their seven games in a row.

In the first game, the Black Bears of Maine, defeated the Warriors 4-1. Freshman Joanie Denby (Sterling Heights, MI/Warren Mott) scored the only Warrior goal at the 3:39 mark in the second period. Freshman Kelly Meech (Coquitlam, British Columbia) added an assist on the goal.

In the second game, Maine defeated the Warriors 4-0. WSU had a tough time getting to the opponent's goal as it was outshot 46-8.

In goal both nights was freshman Anna VanderMarliere. In Thursday's game, VanderMarliere saved 44 shots while on Saturday she saved 42. VanderMarliere for the season is now 3-12.

WSU Names Captain and Alternate -

Sophomore Kelly Pike has been named this year's team captain. Sophomores Serena Hillman and Amy Peters have been named alternate captains. This is the second year Peters has been named alternate.

Team Leaders -

The Warriors now have a three way tie for first place in point scoring with six. The three include freshmen Kelly Meech, Kim Spaulding (Farmington Hills, MI/Harrison) and Katie Jones (Burnaby, British Columbia). Meech has three goals and three assists, as both Spaulding and Jones have two goals and four assists.

Sophomore Amy Peters (Grosse Pointe, MI/University Liggett) is tied for the lead in goals scored with three. Sophomore Serena Hillman (Delta, British Columbia) leads

the team in penalties (13) and penalty minutes (26).

Head Coach Tom O'Malley -

Head Coach Tom O'Malley begins his second year with the Warriors. Last season, he led WSU in its inaugural season to a 0-21 record. Wayne State owns the prestige as being the only NCAA Division I women's hockey program in the state of Michigan.

O'Malley now posts a 140-211-28 record in 16 years of coaching (15 at Boston College, 1 at WSU).

O'Malley is assisted by Alain Frankiewicz.

Next Up for the Warriors -

The Warriors return to action to face Findlay on January 15 at 2 p.m.. WSU will round out the week hosting UCONN on January 20 at 8 p.m. and Michigan State on January 21 at 7 pm.
